
Farmers access 319.3 tons of improved Agro-inputs in 57 **Project districts**

he Ministry of Agriculture is using various strategies aimed at developing the input markets to operate effectively, by scaling it up to meet the expanding demand for agricultural inputs. Some of the measures to maintain the standards of agro-inputs are:

- developing the capacity of district local governments on protocols for quality control of agro-inputs.
- training and accreditation of lower level Agro-input dealers to increase the number of dealers supplying quality inputs in rural areas.
- undertaking close monitoring of quality of agroinputs supplied.
- inspection of seed gardens to certify seeds.
- engagement of national seed companies and agrochemical importers to network with lower input dealers, to enable establishment of local distribution networks and
- training of local and national agro-input dealers on the benefits of local distribution networks.

Through the Agriculture Cluster Development project demand and use of quality production agro-inputs has been greatly stimulated to improve crop production and productivity through the e-Voucher subsidy scheme.

Currently, the project is working with accredited Agroinput dealers and has supported up to 23,726 farmers to access improved technologies valued at UGX 16.3 billion. An additional 13,877 farmers still have to be supported to get access to improved inputs. To date the quantity of inputs accessed by farmers is approximately 319.3 tonnes of seed (maize, rice and beans); 2,671 bags of cassava cuttings and 8,442 tonnes of fertilizer supplied to beneficiary farmers across the 57 districts.





The total number of farmers who have received subsidized inputs through the e-Voucher system by commodity are; 18,426 maize farmers, 14,542 coffee farmers, 7,412 beans farmers, 589 cassava farmers and 531 rice farmers.

The distribution of inputs is made through a network of 165 Agro-input dealers who have established distribution point up to the parish level.

Matching Grant beneficiaries commence construction of Post-harvest and Value addition infrastructure and facilities

 T_{he} Ministry of Agriculture supports implementation of community construction projects to address the chronic challenge of post-harvest losses. This is aimed at enabling the farmers to add value to their produce for better incomes. Most of the facilities once completed will be equipped with drying, cleaning or value addition machinery. By April, 2020, the Ministry had signed grant agreements with 118 Farmer organization from the 24 ACDP pilot districts and funds have been disbursed to most of these organizations as is further elaborated below. Some of grantees have already commenced construction and are at roofing level.

Provision of technical support, monitoring and supervision is provided by the district local governments with the overall technical oversight provided by the Project coordination unit and the MAAIF. These construction projects are expected to stimulate local savings and investment in agriculture, with the total value of the signed agreements of UGX 34 Billion.

Government contribution is UGX 23.4 billion (67%), while the beneficiary farmer groups have contributed UGX 11.5 billion (33%).



Matching Grant beneficiaries- Ntungamo Cluster

Ntungamo cluster is composed of the six districts of Ntungamo, Isingiro, Bushenyi, Kabale, Rukiga and Kabale. Twenty-eight farmer organization received grant awards worth UGX 5,123,306,085 billion of government contribution.

To date, Uganda shillings 4,410,437,799 billion has been disbursed to 22 grantees as depicted below. The grantees membership is composed of 4,807 males and 4,181 females with a total membership of 8,988 members.







Matching Grant beneficiaries- Iganga Cluster

Iganga cluster is composed of the four districts of Iganga, Namutumba, Bugweri and Bugiri. Twenty-eight farmer organizations qualified to received 28 grant awards with total value of UGX 5,812,698,469 worth of government contribution. To date, UGX 5,521,146,782 has been disbursed to all grantees in this cluster. The graph below shows the details of the matching grant beneficiaries.



Matching Grant beneficiaries- Kalungu Cluster

Kalungu cluster is composed of the five districts of Kalungu, Masaka, Kyotera, Rakai and Mpigi. In this cluster, 29 farmer organizations received a total value of UGX 6,141,495,146 worth of government contribution. Uganda shillings 4,530,177,955 has

has been disbursed to 27 grantees as depicted in the graph below. The 29 grantees have a total membership of 8,442 members composed of 4,215 males and 4,227 females.



Matching Grant beneficiaries- Nebbi Cluster

Nebbi cluster is composed of the five districts of Nebbi, Pakwach, Arua, Maracha and Yumbe. Fifteen grant awards worth UGX 3,607,331,595 of government contribution was awarded to this cluster. Of this total grant, UGX 3,279,743,746

has been disbursed to 15 grantees as shown below. The 15 beneficiary farmer organizations in this cluster have a total membership of 1,811 members (896 males and 915 females).



Matching Grant beneficiaries- Amuru Cluster

Amuru cluster is composed of the four districts of Amuru, Nwoya, Gulu and Omoro, 18 grant awards with a total value of UGX 2,761,610,997 was awarded. The contribution of UGX 1,260,007,342 has already been disbursed to nine grantees in this

cluster. The grantees are comprised of 10,292 males and 9,768 females with a total membership of 20,060 members.


